Workshop 1: Short Introduction to Floodplain Risk Management

This workshop aims to provide councillors, committee members and staff new to flood risk management with a basic understanding of the concepts of flood risk management, the meaning of some of the key terms used, and an understanding of how it is undertaken and the outcomes that effective flood risk management can achieve.

Workshop 2: Looking to the Future – What will we need to know in Flood Risk Management by 2020?

This workshop aims to examine what floodplain risk management, emergency managers and planners will need to know by 2020 with the aim of determining research and investigation needs into the future.

Workshop 3: What Can We Learn from Reviews following Recent Floods?

This workshop aims to provide an understanding of the progress and outcomes of recent National and Interstate reviews on flooding and how these may impact upon flood risk management practice into the future. It will also outline progress toward the update of the national best practice manual: Managing the Floodplain and how the industry can input into the further development of this document.

Session 7B “Peak Flow Estimation under the New Australian Rainfall and Runoff”.

This technical workshop aims to provide industry professionals with an understanding of the approach to peak flow estimation as part of the update of Australian Rainfall and Runoff

Field Trip

The following field trip is included in the registration fee and will take place on Wednesday 22 February. A boxed lunch is included.

Coastal Lakes and Foreshores – a coastal perspective of floodplain management

Coastal foreshores and lakes may not immediately come to mind when considering floodplain risk management. Intermittently closed and open lakes and lagoons (ICOLLS) are common on the NSW coast and present a range of complex planning and management issues including community expectations and intervention of ICOLL entrances.

Coastal inundation is another flood process that coastal councils are required to manage. Large storms offshore can elevate nearshore water levels to a point of inundating low lying coastal development. This “flood event” illustrates the complicated interaction between coastal and fluvial flood processes and how to adopt an integrated management approach.

The field trip will travel to Burrill Lake south of Ulladulla in the Shoalhaven City Council area to explore issues associated with the preparation of flood risk management plan for an ICOLL. The field trip will continue to Surfside in Batemans Bay to investigate the impacts of sea level rise and coastal inundation on a low lying suburb that has many existing properties and public infrastructure at risk.
